

Aurizon Community Giving Fund

Provides support to charities or community groups in the areas of health and wellbeing, community safety, environment and education.

Aurizon, working in conjunction with Good2Give, has established the Aurizon Community Giving Fund to provide cash grants for charitable initiatives and projects aimed to improve the health and wellbeing, community safety, the environment and education in local communities in which Aurizon operates and their employees reside.

These funding categories are defined as follows:

- Health & Wellbeing: Initiatives that improve a community's health and wellbeing, such as cardiovascular health related projects e.g. getting active/physical activity or healthy lifestyle programs, and mental health support
- Community Safety: Initiatives that increase safety and security in our local communities, such as emergency response, domestic and family violence, natural disaster prevention/minimisation measures, accident prevention and road safety
- Education: Support in areas such as literacy and numeracy, life education, apprenticeships and traineeships, and in particular, increasing and retaining skills in regional areas.
- Environment: Initiatives that promote environmental enhancement in the communities through which Aurizon operates. Focused on issues such as improving biodiversity of natural habitats, community conservation and environmental education (for example, land rehabilitation and revegetation programs, clean-up and education days and local conservation projects).

All applications for an Aurizon Community Giving Fund grant must fit within at least one of these funding categories to be eligible for consideration.
